Allentown Central Catholic High School, founded in 1926, is a four year co-educational, college preparatory school drawing from **seventeen** surrounding school districts, across Lehigh and Northampton Counties. With total enrollment of **650**, the student-body reflects the richly diverse racial, ethnic, religious, and socio-economic community of the surrounding area. Allentown Central Catholic also boasts a growing population of international students. There are fifty-five lay teachers and one priest on the faculty.

ACADEMIC OVERVIEW

Allentown Central Catholic High School operates on a 5 day (A-E) cycle with eight 45 minute periods. 88% of a student's time is class instruction which includes large and small group instruction along with lab periods. Grades are recorded numerically. Our passing mark is 70. Grade point average and class rank are based on a diocesan quality point system using grades from major courses taken during the school year. GPA and rank are cumulative and are calculated at the end of each semester. GPA is on a weighted 4.0 scale.

A = 93-100 B = 85-92 C = 75-84 D = 70-74 F = 0-69

GRADE POINT AVERAGE AND QUALITY TABLE

Grade Point Average (GPA), is calculate using the quality points a student has earned in each major course a student completes. Major courses are weighted according to degree of difficulty, on a scale of 1 to 4; the more challenging the course, the more quality points are earned.


Level 1 courses at ACCHS include AP courses; Level 2 courses include Honors courses; Level 3, most CP courses; Level 4, a few, paced- down CP Courses.

The Quality Point Conversion chart on the next page indicates a Diocesan Standard for Achievement of grades at different levels. GPA is cumulative and becomes available, with class rank, to colleges upon a student's application. GPA, along with standardized test scores and teacher recommendations, become predictors for success in post-secondary education.

COVID-19 RELATED CHANGES AND POLICIES

Starting in March of 2020, ACCHS students shifted to virtual learning. Students were required to log in for weekly Zoom classes (1-2 per course, per week) and complete all weekly assignments and assessments. All grading policies remained the same, with the exception that final exams were not administered.

Starting in August of 2020, ACCHS students began a hybrid model of 50% in-person instruction and 50% online instruction. This model provides live instruction to both online and in-person students. Online students are required to log into Zoom daily at their normal class time and join in their classroom discussions, from 8:10am to 2:50pm each day. All grading policies remain the same. This instruction model will remain in place until all state-mandated restrictions are lifted.

COLLEGE CREDIT OPPORTUNITIES

Courses are offered through partnerships with Alvernia University, DeSales University and Lehigh Carbon Community College. Advanced Placement Exams are standardized tests administered by ACCHS and scored by the Educational Testing Service.

Advanced Placement exams are graded on a 5 point scale with scores of 3-5 being considered qualified for college credit. Colleges and Universities determine whether or not to accept AP exam grades for credit. Exam dates and fees are determined by the College Board. All students who enroll in an AP course are required to take the AP Exam.
